The Challenge is completed in a notebook, spiral or composition. Each day they will look at the calendar to find that day's numbers. Then, they will add, subtract, round, etc. just basic mathematical operations to maintain their base skills. The final item on the daily list is skip counting multiplication facts. Students should enter fourth grade with a strong fact fluency of the multiplication facts 1-9.

They will turn in their notebook the first week of school. I will be giving full completion grades for anyone with 30 or more day complete. Any student who completes all 50 day will be receiving a prize as well.
