# 2020 Summer Reading Assignment



With that being said, I have assigned a few necessary summer reading assignments to properly prepare you (and me) for middle school. This year's theme is **BUILDING CHARACTER**. Please be prepared to reflect on yourself and the literature you experience with this theme in mind.

### Task #1 – Read for literary experience!

1. Read Mildred D. Taylor's *Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry* (ISBN-13: 978-0142401125, Puffin Books)



- 2. Complete the Dialectical Journal entries on pages 3 and 4 of this packet (PRINT the document and HAND-WRITE your answers)
  - Pick 5 characters and write 1 entry for each
  - *In the right column* of your journal, explain how your chosen character's choices impacted their own character or the character of others **in 3 or more sentences**.
    - Key question to consider:
       How did each character's experiences and choices build their character (in other words, "grow" them as people)?
  - In the left column, use supporting quotes from the text as evidence for your character claims
- 3. Be prepared to discuss and be TESTED over the book in the first couple days of school.

#### Task #2 – Read for enjoyment, knowledge, and inspiration!

- **1. Read your choice** of *one* of these two books:
  - Prince Caspian by C.S. Lewis (Fantasy/Christian Allegory)

- The Bronze Bow by Elizabeth George Speare (Historical Fiction)
- 2. Identify an example of "great writing" from your choice book and prepare a 1-2 min. oral presentation (using only a notecard) to explain WHY you chose that specific example

On your notecard include:

- a. Your cited example (approximately 1-2 paragraphs)
- b. Bullet points on why you chose this example

"Great writing" examples can be but are not limited to:

- Strong character moments
- Important tension or conflict
- Rich imagery or figurative language use
- Thematic/ teaching or heartwarming moments
- Characters or moments that made the reader feel understood
