Task 1-Read for Literary Experience!

- 1. **Read** S.E. Hinton's *The Outsiders*. (It is recommended, but not required, that you annotate your book for moments where you see Ponyboy struggling with who he is and where he belongs (internal conflict) and moments where you see him reflecting on his divided society (Socs versus Greasers).
- 2. Be prepared to discuss and be TESTED over the book the first few days of school.

1. **Read a non-fiction book** of your choice from the list of titles (below). This book should be one that most captures your interest—it entices you! Make sure your parent agrees with your selection as well.
