Work should be completed in a notebook, spiral notebook, or composition book. Please label each day's work neatly.

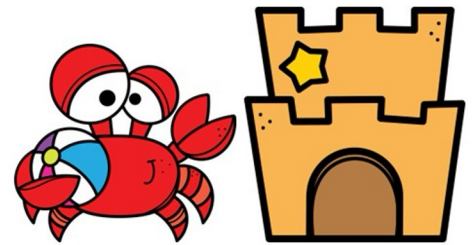
Please have a parent or older sibling check work for accuracy.

Thank you for your partnership and support. We hope your family enjoys a wonderful summer!

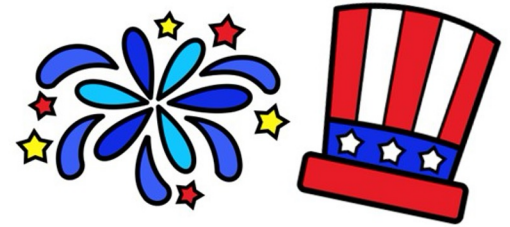
